BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Happy Day Paint Branch,

This month the Board of Trustees (BOT) has four important updates to share with you: the selection of a Developmental Minister, the efforts underway to ensure continued operations of our church office, planning for the resumption of inperson programming in a safe and meaningful way, and deck repairs.

As was shared in the letter sent out on April 28th, the BOT voted unanimously to invite Ann Kadlecek to join the Paint Branch community after receiving a unanimous recommendation from the Search Team. To learn more about Ann please click here to review the letter. I have heard that some individuals did not receive this letter. If you did not receive the original letter, please contact me at boardchair@pbuuc.org.

As you know our Church Administrator, Chuck Bury, recently announced his resignation to be effective on or before June 18th. Chuck's last day with us ended up being Thursday, April 29th. We wish Chuck well in his future endeavors. Please be aware that the church office will remain closed through at least May 11 for cleaning and organization purposes. However, the voicemail and all PBUUC email accounts are being monitored. Please continue to send announcements for the ContinUUm or Branches by the appropriate deadlines. You may also use the church office voicemail, PBUUC email addresses, or the BOT email (bot@pbuuc.org) to communicate urgent issues that need to be addressed. A selection team is in the process of selecting a new full-time Church Administrator. As we navigate the temporary vacancy in this position, we welcome the support of volunteers. Thank you to those who have already offered your assistance. Please reach out to bot@pbuuc.org for more information about how you too can help out. All of our volunteers thank you for your patience and flexibility as we transition over these next few weeks.

Additionally, the BOT continues the process of focused consideration on how and when to resume in-person programming. We recognize that many of you are ready and waiting to resume some in-person programming as soon as possible while others are not yet ready to do so. Please know that the priority of the BOT is to make sure that we are putting forth our best effort to make sure any return prioritizes health and safety and allows for all congregants to access meaningful worship and programming experiences across multiple platforms. This month we delegated a team, co-chaired by Keith Miller and Carol Boston, to engage in the technical planning needed for multi-platform programming going forward. They will be looking for additional team members to join them in this new venture. Please reach out to Keith or Carol if you can support this work.

In consultation with this tech team, the Continuity Committee, BAG, the Worship Associates, and staff, the BOT will be slowly phasing in in-person options. All of our volunteers ask for your patience and flexibility as we navigate this challenging and unprecedented transition. To stay informed, please review the ContinUUm each week for relevant updates and announcements. If you want to volunteer to support this effort in any way, please let us know. We need you!

Finally, we have had an engineer inspect our deck to determine its estimated lifespan. Over the next few months, needed repairs recommended by the engineer will be made to the existing structure as we prepare for a more significant replacement within the next three years. Until these repairs are finished, please do not congregate on the deck. It should only be used for ingress or egress from the buildings.

Change is truly afoot at Paint Branch. May it bring bright days ahead.

Connected in Community

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Connected in Community annual campaign. The pledge drive officially ended in April, and we can announce the final numbers. We received commitments totaling \$257,314 from 81 pledges representing 92 members and 9 friends of the congregation. The average pledge of \$3,177 and median pledge of \$2,400 are both significant increases over previous years and demonstrate incredible generosity from everyone who participated. Unfortunately, these results also represent 17 fewer pledges than last year and \$30,000 less than last year's total pledge amount. Much work remains for church leadership to build our annual budget for the coming year based on the reality of transitioning into a smaller congregation. In May, the church office will send acknowledgment letters to all who pledged. The Stewardship Committee is grateful for the efforts of our Visiting Stewards who reached out to over 150 members and friends to have conversations about how we are all "Connected in Community" at PBUUC. RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

Happy May, my good people!

There is so much happening at Paint Branch and sometimes it's hard to catch my breath. How about you? We have news about our developmental minister, we're working on refining a lot of processes among staff, and we're discerning how we may begin to slowly return to the building.

The current topic closest to my heart is Come to Practice, an initiative that we're working hard to bring to fruition. The notion of Come to Practice was born in the Religious Education Team, and we are now broadening that scope to the entire congregation. The aim is to create "pathways to practice" so that we may go deeper into our Unitarian Universalist identities. We are discerning the elements of Come to Practice with a series of after service conversations, the first of which was April 4th. We asked the question: What do we come to practice?

Initially, for the Religious Education program, we identified some areas for practice for our children and youth. Those included Leadership Development, Service, Liberation (anti-racism and anti-oppression), Curiosity, Hope. A significant number of folx attended our meeting on April 4th to speak about what they come to practice. The overwhelming majority of people responded with some variation on community. Among the other varied responses to "what do we come to practice?" relationships, accountability, challenging assumptions, learning a variety of points of view, motivation and inspiration, bringing our faith to life in our day to day, humility, support, singing, responsibility, groundedness . . . these were the broad topics that arose during our conversation.

Our next discussion will be on May 2nd, and we will be engaging the question "why do we come to practice?" This might be a more challenging question than "what" and I can't wait to hear all of the ideas. We will meet again on May 16th to discuss "how do we come to practice?" and that is where the rubber will meet the road. We hope to combine the three questions and glean some ways to that we can create pathways to practice. I hope you'll all come to participate, and if you can't be there in person, my email (dmre@pbuuc.org) is always open for your ideas.

General Assembly (GA) - Annual Meeting of the Denomination June 23 to June 27

Registration/Financial Assistance.

Registration for this year's GA is \$200. The UUA is offering several options for financial assistance, including payment plans, work scholarships, and aid. It is actively encouraging folks to apply. You must register to attend all programming and receive post-GA materials.

Paint Branch Delegates.

Paint Branch is entitled to three delegates. Delegates take part in the actual discussion and voting on motions made to do the business and advance the justice agenda of the denomination. Paint Branch delegates will be formally appointed at the June 6 Annual Meeting. At that meeting, the congregation will also vote to either instruct our delegates to vote their conscience or consider input from congregation members on issues that will be voted on. Delegates must register. PBUUC does not currently provide financial support to delegates. The UUA President, in consultation with the GA Planning Committee, invites a distinguished guest each year to address the Assembly as the Ware Lecturer. Some of the Lecturers since 1925 have been: Jane Addams, Sister Joan Campbell, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Holly Near, Reinhold Niebuhr, Mary Oliver, Krista Tippets, Kurt Vonnegut, Jr., and Cornell West.
