## **Notes from the Minister**

As November moves into December, many of us are pulled toward family and community connections.

Thanksgiving and Friendsgiving dinners invite us to reconnect over food, and take time for those relationships. The coming holidays



bring us more opportunities and celebrations, plans and preparations.

In addition, I find I am reflective about the year now ending, and the year coming up. I have spent this first year learning who is Paint Branch, and building connections with you.

As I think about my goal for this coming year, I am exploring Deepening Connections. I think of this as a goal both within and outside our Paint Branch Community. Within Paint Branch, I wonder if we might start a program of Small Group Ministry, also known as Covenant Groups. Groups are formed of eight to ten people including a facilitator. They would meet monthly to explore different spiritual and life questions. It invites the group into deeper relationship, as together they meet and discuss their own thoughts and feelings and understanding of the world and their own beliefs. One thing I have heard from newcomers to Paint Branch is that they wonder how to really get engaged and involved with the community. Small Group Ministry might be one of the things that would invite new people into deeper relationship.

# **Board Chair Musings**

Today, my husband and I put lights in all the front-facing windows, our first act of getting ready for the winter holiday season. It felt good to see these lights, cheap plastic candles that the previous owner of our house left for us, lit up and making the house seem a little warmer and more welcoming.

The Board has begun working on a number of projects we would like to let you know about. The first is a review of the current church bylaws (<a href="http://www.pbuuc.org/bylaws/">http://www.pbuuc.org/bylaws/</a>). The current bylaws have not been revisited in 12 years and are rather minimal in comparison to other examples we have seen. We will be putting together a task force to look at what we currently have and recommend changes based on experience and review of other examples. The Board as a whole will then review the recommended modifications and forward them to the congregation to vote on during our annual meeting, which will be June 9, 2019. If you have an interest in participating, please contact either Rev. Rachel or Carmelita Carter-Sykes.

Second, we have been made aware of the fact that our deck is again wearing out. The structure is showing signs of needing to be replaced, not just for cosmetic reasons. This church has had a love/hate relationship with the deck for many years and so we are going to be enlisting the help of an architect to provide us options. We can simply replace what we have with another wooden structure, create a structure that is more permanent such as one supported by metal and/or concrete, or use an earthen berm to create a path from the parking lot to the Meeting House and RE Building. There are many issues to understand and work out. And yes, one of those things will be how to pay for this. The Board will be talking about this issue for many months to come and at some point, we will be eliciting your opinions as well as creating some task forces to help with the work that will be involved.

Lastly, the Board has started talking about how to create a long-range plan, one that includes a vision for our physical plant as well as relationships both inside and outside. We will use the PBUUC mission and vision statements as our guide and keep the congregation informed throughout the process. We hope to have a mid-winter congregational listening event in a few months where we can gather your input and aspirations.

Look for the DARRT announcement about the workshop "New Day Rising: Identifying Your Congregation's Next Steps in the Struggle with White Supremacy Culture" to which many of the Board will be attending.

I hope your chosen holidays are enjoyable.
